From the Pastor

As we begin the new year, my exhortation to one and all is simply that you apply yourself to the "ordinary means of grace." That is to say, attend to God's Word and prayer, and especially in the public gathering of God's people. Jesus' prayer to his Father was "Sanctify them in the truth; your word is truth" (John 17:17). Jesus promised that when two or three gather in his name he is present with us in a special way (Matt. 18:20). It is especially as we draw near to God in corporate worship that he commands the blessing of life forevermore (Ps. 133:3). Let me take this time to draw special attention to the opportunities that will be yours to study God's word, or as the saints of old would say - "to sit under God's word" - in the coming year.

On Lord's Day mornings, starting January 13th, we will be going through the first eighteen chapters of Exodus. When we think of Exodus, our first thoughts are probably about either the exodus from Egypt or the giving of God's law at Sinai. And of course, redemption and obedience are important themes in Exodus. But perhaps the huge theme often missed is the importance of worship. Recall how over and over Moses and the people of God stress to Pharaoh their need to go into the wildness "to sacrifice to the Lord our God" (3:18; 5:3; 8:27, 28). As the Lord eventually shows us, redemption from bondage in Egypt was for the very purpose of worshipping the Lord. May the Lord teach us about worship as well as redemption in this study.

As for Wednesday evenings, I encourage you, if you are not providentially hindered (job, sickness or serious impediment), join us on Wednesday evenings for a delicious meal and a study of God's word. This winter and spring we will be studying 1 Thessalonians. I must admit that apart from my reading through the Bible annually for several years now and occasional references to the return of Jesus as Paul explains it in 4:13-8 or references to spare verses here or there, I have not spent a great deal of time in this book. Yet, as I have prepared for this study, I have reached the opinion that it may be one of the largely unmined treasures of God's word. Much like Philippians, 1 Thessalonians is written by Paul to a congregation he dearly loves, as evidenced in the warm, encouraging tone. Furthermore, word for word 1 Thessalonians may have more to say about the return of Christ than any other book. It also has much to say about ministry leadership. All who have ministry leadership roles, and especially church officers, will find it has much to say to us about how we go about our craft.

Finally, I encourage you to come back out on Sunday evenings for study and prayer. There is no better way to keep the Lord's Day the Lord's Day (as opposed to his morning or hour) than to close the day together as the people of God. We will be engaged in a study of God's word on the Lord's Day evenings as well. Yet in this study we will not be going through a particular section of scripture; rather, it will be a doctrinal study. We will be studying the doctrinal standards of our church as we find them in the Westminster Confession of Faith. Yes, we will be studying the Westminster Confession of Faith. People often ask me what we as Presbyterians believe about various topics (and why?). And it is good to ask such questions. The problem is that the answers to such questions are seldom found in one particular "proof passage." We must study the whole of God's word to see what it has to say about any particular topic. The Westminster Confession of Faith is the product of such study; and as such, it is a distillation of scripture's teaching on some of the more important topics. So, as we study the Westminster Confession of Faith, we learn what God has to say about various topics, and thus what we as Presbyterians believe.

So, these are the studies I have planned and these are the times for us to study God's word together. As we engage in this endeavor, we will be transformed by God's word and better equipped for service; and our church will be the better for it. I look forward to seeing you and may the Lord's blessing be upon these plans and our church this new year.
