### From the Pastor

If we do have a holiday of truly Christian origins, it may well be Thanksgiving. The first Thanksgiving was celebrated by the Pilgrims following their harvest in the fall of 1621, about a year after landing at Cape Cod. Though they had experienced many hardships and their losses weighed heavily upon their hearts, they were particularly grateful to God for their preservation. So, they gathered with their Wampanoag Indian friends and shared a three-day autumn harvest feast. The Indians listened as the Bible was read and prayers were offered and food was enjoyed by all. It was later in 1863 in the midst of Civil War that President Lincoln declared Thanksgiving to be a national holiday.

Thanksgiving is approaching and Thanksgiving is a time in which we are particularly reminded of the many blessings we enjoy. Thanksgiving truly is a mark of saving faith. I think particularly of Psalm 136 which begins "Give thanks to the LORD, for he is good, for his steadfast love endures forever" (v. 1). The psalmist rehearses God's work in creation, his loving redemption of his people from bondage, his planting his people in the promised land, and his enduring love which will not let his people go.

No doubt most of us look forward to an enjoyable time of family, friends, and food this Thanksgiving. For many of us (well, I am speaking for myself) Thanksgiving is the one meal we look forward to all year long (and may last all afternoon long). Fortunately, Thanksgiving is not quite as commercialized as Christmas. Yet, not unlike Christmas, it can be easy for us to forget the "reason for the season." So, may we stop to give thanks. May we thank God for the measure of health and happiness we enjoy; may we thank him for friends and loved ones; may we especially thank him for his incredible gift of salvation to us in Christ. May we thank the Lord for the fact that we live in a country in which we are still, in large measure, free to worship in spirit and truth and carry out the Great Commission. And as we think of the civil liberty we enjoy, may we give thanks for the many men and women who have served, fought, and died to preserve that freedom for us. And one last thing, perhaps we should take the time as those Pilgrims did to share that meal with others who may be lacking some of those blessings we so enjoy.
