From the Pastor:

"The Christian and Spiritual Warfare"

The apostle Paul begins verse 10 of chapter 6 with the word "finally." I wonder what his readers were thinking when they heard that word. "Finally" does not always signal he is nearing the end of his letter (Phil. 3:1). Here it does. The apostle is about to "land the plane" and does so in a surprising, interesting, and strategic way. He begins in verses 10 by informing the Ephesians that they are engaged in spiritual warfare. They need to "be strong in the Lord and in the strength of his might" because their struggle is not against mere human powers but against spiritual forces, Satan and his minions. The church and Christians need to be aware of this. The church needs to realize that it is engaged in spiritual warfare. Believers need to know the same.

Isn't it interesting where this comes in this letter. It is after Paul has spent two and a half chapters instructing and exhorting the Ephesians how to "walk worthy of the calling to which you have been called …" (4:1). They are to "be imitators of God as his beloved children…" (5:1). They are no longer to walk as the world around them walks but rather live holy, upright lives (5:3-14). They are to walk wisely not foolishly (5:14-21). Of particular note is 5:21—6:9 where the apostle explains how the Ephesians are to submit "to one another out of reverence for Christ" (5:21). That includes marriage relations, parental relations, and labor relations. What does that mean? It means that if you try to live out the biblical principles for marriage in a culture which opposes those principles you can expect Satan to do his best to bring strife to your marriage. It means that if you want to raise your children in the "discipline and instruction of the Lord" you can expect Satan to do his best to cause trouble. It means you decide that you are going to live by biblical principles in the workplace Satan will oppose you. In other words, when you decide you are going to try extra hard to live for Christ in this fallen world you should expect opposition from the evil one. Don't be surprised by it.

So, what is the Christian to do? He is to put on "the whole armor of God" so that he can "stand against the schemes of the devil" (6:11-8a). Most importantly, the believer is to give himself to prayer (6:18b-20). He is to pray for pastors and missionaries; he is to pray for other believers; he is to pray for the church. Christians often set out anew to serve the Lord only to be surprised that they meet trouble at every turn. We ought not be surprised. The apostle Paul warned us that it would be that way. Yet he also told us what to do – fasten on the belt of truth, put on the breastplate of righteousness, shod our feet with the gospel of peace, take up the shield of faith and take the helmet of salvation (6:14-8a). And put on each piece with prayer (6:18b-20). Expect spiritual opposition and prepare for the battle. In the word of George Duffield, "Stand up, stand up for Jesus, stand in his strength alone; the arm of flesh will fail you, ye dare not trust your own. Put on the gospel armor, each piece put on with prayer; where duty calls or danger, be never wanting there" (*Stand up, Stand up for Jesus*).
