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From the Pastor:

"Revival: Speak to the Bones and Pray for the Wind"

By the time you read this our annual Revival week will be less than three months away. Since Dr. Robertson has selected "Praying for Revival" as his theme, I want to spend the next three newsletter columns looking at passages which inform us how prayer and revival are so vitally connected. We begin with a familiar passage to many – Ezekiel 37:14, the so called "Valley of Dry Bones" passage.

The passage begins with the Lord carrying the prophet out into a valley of dry bones. The dry bones symbolize the nation of Israel in exile, apparently dead with all hope lost. It is in this context, that the Lord commands the prophet to do a very strange thing. He commands Ezekiel to prophesy over the bones and promises that if the prophet does, he (the Lord) will cause the bones to come to life forming resurrected bodies (vv. 1-6). The prophet asks no questions and raises no objections; rather, he speaks to the bones. And, lo and behold, the bones come together, joints, ligaments, muscle and skin. So, we have gone from bleached bones to stray corpses; all the same there is no breath in the bodies (vv. 7-8).

So, the Lord continues with stage two of the resurrection process. He orders the prophet to "Prophesy to the breath." Perhaps this is the best place for me to tell you that the Hebrew word for "breath" can also be translated "wind" or "spirit." Back to the text, the prophet is to say: "Thus says the LORD God: Come from the four winds, O breath, and breathe on these slain, that they may live" (v. 9). The prophet again trusts and obeys, and guess what happens. We read, "The breath came into them, and they lived and stood on their feet, an exceedingly great army" (10). From there the Lord explains to the prophet that the bones are the "whole house of Israel." He tells Ezekiel that he will do a work in them which is akin to the resurrection of the dead. He tells him that Israel will know that the Lord is God when he opens their graves and raises them to life. Then he reiterates that he will put his Spirit within them and they will live and he concludes, "Then you shall know that I am the LORD; I have spoken and I will do it, declares the LORD" (vv. 11-4).

The whole scene looks forward to the return of Israel from exile but also to the resurrection of Israel in the form of the church in the New Testament. It also hints at the physical resurrection of the dead – Jesus first, then later believers. Furthermore, it is a picture of spiritual resurrection. And finally, it is a picture of what God does in times of revival. He brings seemingly dead churches to life by bringing to life human beings, formerly dead in their sins and trespasses. And there are essentially, two primary elements – preaching (prophesying, understood as "forthtelling the word of God") and praying/petitioning.

While I was in seminary, since there was no other place to take my daily health walk, I used to ride to a cemetery less than a mile away to take my walk. Now I walked but even though I was a cemetery, I never once thought about practicing my preaching out there in the middle of that graveyard. I wouldn't say cemeteries spook me out, but still it was often near dark; so, I came, I walked, and I left. Yet that is precisely what preachers are supposed to do. There are quite often people in our congregations who are spiritually dead (Eph. 2:1-3) and there is nothing they can do to raise themselves to life. Yet the same word of Christ that raised Lazarus to physical life, can raise spiritual corpses to life. God does that when he saves any individual soul. And he does it massive numbers during periods of revival.

Yet as Ezekiel 37 teaches, all the preaching/prophesying in the world does absolutely no good, unless the Holy Spirit comes to bring life to the dead. And so, we not only preach for revival but also pray for it. After all, it was our Savior who said, "If you then, who are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will the heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!" (Lk. 11:13 ESV) I will close with this quote by David Cassidy (a PCA pastor, not the Partridge guy): "Speak to the bones and pray for the wind." That is a summary of the message of Ezekiel 37:1-14 and it is how we should think about revival. So, as we prepare for Revival week, let's pray for those who will preach and those who will hear. And may the Lord bring life to the dead. May he revive dead spirits; may he revive his church.
