#### From the Pastor:

## "Making the Best Use of a Medical Leave"

Before I go any further, I want to thank our Ruling Elders for stepping in and performing all my ministry and administrative functions in my absence. Church life simply would not have continued without their labors. Second, I want to thank the Women in the Church for the special fellowship times they scheduled which seemed to really bring the congregation together. Third, I thank the Teaching and Ruling Elders who so ably filled the pulpit during the past eight weeks. I know you really enjoyed them. Now, inasmuch as the apostle Paul exhorts us to make good use of our time (Eph. 5:16), I want to explain how I have spent some of my time these last eight weeks.

And see if there be any grievous way in me, and lead me in the way everlasting!" (Ps. 139:23 ESV) As I have applied David's words to my life, I have found areas of sin (none being scandalous) of which I need to repent. Along with my family, we have worshipped in other churches, seen how they worship, sat under sound preaching from a variety of men, and enjoyed rich fellowship. I have tried to help Ginny a bit more around the house. Finally, I have spent time with ministry colleagues who encouraged me greatly.

Those are some of the ways I have spent my time on medical leave. I feel much more refreshed and ready to get back to work. And I look forward to getting back in the groove of preparing sermons, worshipping with you all, pastoral visitation, and everything else ministry entails. I pray for the Lord's blessing on our future together, just as he has blessed my time away.

The Women in the Church (WIC) quarterly meeting was held Tuesday, July 9 at 7:00 pm. Chrystal Weatherly, Chairman of Missions to the World (MTW) led the program about "Who is Missions to the World?" She shared worldwide statistics and information about church planting.

Chrystal showed a video about a MTW refuge for girls, Senegal Girls Home, in Africa. This home started small and has grown to provide shelter, education, and skills for girls at risk of being trafficked. The WIC voted to send a \$250 donation to this girls home.
