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From the Pastor:

"Learning, Knowing and Passing on the Faith"

So, the story goes, an officer in the United States army was in a great western city at a time of intense excitement and violent rioting. The streets were overrun daily by a dangerous crowd. One day this officer observed a man approaching him with a great calm and firmness about him. His very demeaner inspired confidence. This officer was so impressed with this man's bearing amid the surrounding uproar that once he had passed him, he turned back only to find the stranger staring back at him. The officer then came back toward the stranger and giving him a chest bump asked him flatly, "What is the chief end of man?' Then, upon hearing the man respond, "Man's chief end is to glorify God and enjoy him forever" (WSC #1), the officer rejoined – "Ah, I knew you were a Shorter Catechism boy by your looks!" To which the stranger quickly responded, "Why, that was just what I was thinking of you" (*The Christian Life* by Sinclair he Ferguson, 8-9).

For more than a hundred years, the famous *New England Primer, the* beginning textbook for America's children, contained *The Shorter Catechism* (That is the Westminster Shorter Catechism). An 1843 printing of the primer states: "Our Puritan fathers brought the Shorter Catechism with them across the ocean and laid it on the same shelf with the family Bible. They taught it diligently to their children. ... If in this catechism the true and fundamental doctrines of the Gospel are expressed in fewer and better words and definitions than in any other summary, why ought we not now train up a child in the way he should go" (*The Confessions of Our Faith ... Fortress Edition, xx*).

There was a day when many, if not most, Presbyterians knew their Shorter Catechism. It was a rite of passage for youth, if not children. There was a day when pastoral visitation by church elders included making sure parents were catechizing their children. These questions and answers not only teach us the way of salvation and how to live before God, but they also teach us how to pray and how to teach. So, these questions are surely one of the best ways we can guard the good deposit (2 Tim. 1:14), train our children in the discipline (positive discipline) and instruction of the Lord (Eph. 6:4) and pass on the faith to other believers who will teach others also (2 Tim. 2:2).

That said, if we have never learned the Shorter Catechism, we should consider learning it. If we have learned it and forgotten it, we should relearn it. And once we learn it, we should assist others in learning it, especially our children and young adults. To that end, our session has decided to help you learn and teach the catechism. In our last session meeting we discussed an article by Dr. Barry York entitled, "Shepherding through Catechesis." The elders shared their memories of learning the catechism, how they have used it, and how we could encourage our members to learn it.

This is still a work in process, but here is what we have thus far. Each Lord's Day, starting Sunday, September 6th, successive questions and answers to the catechism will be run in the weekly worship bulletin. That afternoon, ruling elder Ricky DeWitt will put out a call on OneCallNow in which, among other things, he will read the catechism question and answer for that week. We encourage you to set a goal of learning (or relearning) that one question each week. If we keep up that pace, our whole church will learn the Shorter Catechism in just over two years. We also intend to purchase some copies of the catechism and make them available to you in the vestibule. Later we may develop some type of recognition program for people (or at least youth) who have memorized the catechism. That's it for now. And happy catechesis to you.
