From the Pastor:

"Jesus, the Friend of Sinners"

"Jesus! what a Friend for sinners! Jesus! Lover of my soul; Friends may fail me, foes assail me, He, my Savior, makes me whole. Hallelujah! what a Savior! Hallelujah! what a Friend! Saving, helping, keeping, loving, He is with me to the end. Jesus! what a Strength in weakness! Let me hide myself in him; Tempted, tried, and sometimes failing, He, my strength, my vict'ry wins. [Refrain] Jesus! what a Help in sorrow! While the billows o'er me roll, Even when my heart is breaking, He, my Comfort, helps my soul. [Refrain] Jesus! what a Guide and Keeper! While the tempest still is high, Storms about me, night o'ertakes me, He, my Pilot, hears my cry. [Refrain] Jesus! I do now receive him, More than all in him I find, He hath granted me forgiveness, I am his, and he is mine. [Refrain] Those are the words of J. Wilbur Chapman, a Presbyterian pastor, turned traveling evangelist who toured with the great D.L. Moody. They are also the lyrics of one of my favorite hymns. More importantly, they tell the story of every Christian.

The fact that Jesus is a friend of sinners is at the heart of every true revival. Revival is a time when vast numbers of sinners come to see Jesus as their friend. That includes some of the most unlikely people because of their notorious lifestyle, as well as many upstanding church members whom no one suspected to be lost. In times of revival all kinds of people from all kinds of backgrounds come to see Jesus as a friend of sinners.

Such was the case during the ministry of Dr. D. Martyn Lloyd-Jones. Lloyd-Jones was a physician (assistant clinician to Thomas Horder, the physician who served the royal family in Britian) turned pastor best known for his twenty year ministry at Westminster Chapel in London. However, Lloyd-Jones' first pastorate is more closely linked to revival. Transitioning away from medicine and with no formal ministerial training, Lloyd-Jones began as a lay pastor at a Calvinistic Methodist chapel in Sandfields, Aberavon, a residential district of Port Albot in the south part of Wales. He ministered there during the Great Depression from 1927 through 1938. Through the prayers of the saints and the powerful preaching of the Word many of the most unlikely people came to Christ, as the Lord wrought a mighty revival during Lloyd-Jones' Sandfields ministry. Lives were changed and the small community was transformed as sinners came to Christ.

Yes, we are quickly approaching our annual Revival services which are scheduled for March 30th through April 2nd. Our speaker this year is Dr. Neil Stewart, also a physician turned pastor. Neil has pastored churches in Mississippi, Georgia, and North Carolina and is now the senior minister of the First Presbyterian Church in Columbia, SC. Dr. Stewart has chosen the theme – "Jesus, the Sinner's Friend" and will be teaching and preaching from Luke 5:12-32. The titles for his messages are – "The Outcast Made Clean," "The Helpless Made Whole," and "The Traitor Brought Home." Our weeknight speakers will be the following: Rev. Juan Rodriquez, the Reformed University Fellowship minister at UNC-Charlotte; Rev. Bo Collins, the pastor of Redeemer Presbyterian Church in Southern Pines; and Dr. Greg Salazar who is the organizing pastor of Myers Park Mission Church. Special music will include a combined choir of our Richmond County PCA churches, the Crestview Baptist Church choir, the First Baptist Church choir, and the Cameronian Boys. Mark the dates on your calendar now (March 30th through April 2nd) and start praying that God would indeed bring a mighty revival to Ellerbe.
